

JAPAN

Japan is a nation in East Asia, made up of approximately 6,852 islands! The name Japan means 'Sun-Origin', which is why you might hear the country referred to as the 'Land of the Rising Sun'. The four largest islands are Honshu, Hokkaido, Kyushu and Shikoku, making up 97% of Japan's land area. It is the world's tenth-largest population, with over 127 million people. Honshu's Greater Tokyo Area (which includes the capital city of Tokyo), is the largest metropolitan area in the world with over 30 million residents!



Inspired by the Eiffel Tower in France, Tokyo Tower serves as a communications tower and is the second tallest man-made structure in Japan. It is often lit up in a variety of colours to commemorate special events.

EXCITING HISTORY

Few nations on Earth have had a more colourful history than Japan. Settled around 35,000 years ago by the Palaeolithic people from the Asian mainland, hunter-gatherers fashioned fur clothing, wooden houses, and elaborate clay vessels. Around the year 600, the Chinese writing system and Buddhism were introduced to Japan, and society began to divide into clans (or groups), ruled from the Yamato Province.

Adopting many Chinese customs and innovations over the years, Japan has seen the rise and fall of emperors, rule by samurai warriors, isolation from the outside world, expansion over most of Asia, defeat and rebound.

NINJAS

Raised floors help indicate when to take off slippers or shoes. At the entrance to a home in Japan, the floor will usually be raised about 15 cm indicating you should take off your shoes and put on slippers. If the house has a tatami mat room, its floor may be raised 2.5-5 cm, indicating you should take off your slippers!
